## RENEWING THE COMMITMENT

**O**ver more than 65 years, letter carriers have raised millions of dollars for the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA), the union's official charity. Each branch conducts its own grassroots fundraising activities with events such as bowlathons, golf and poker tournaments, and raffles. Those efforts add up, to provide major support for MDA's research and programs each year.

NALC has been a strong partner with MDA since the charity was founded in 1950. The union became MDA's first national sponsor, naming MDA its official charity in 1952. Letter carriers have raised more than \$102 million for its mission since then.

Those funds have helped MDA support groundbreaking research for new life-changing treatments and therapies for neuromuscular diseases, including some that have emerged in only the last few months. These treatments are helping children and adults with neuromuscular diseases maintain strength and slow the decline of bodily functions.

### New advances

Thanks to MDA-sponsored research, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in September approved Exondys 51, the first disease-modifying drug to treat Duchenne muscular dystrophy (DMD). A disease-modifying drug slows the progression of a disease instead of merely treating symptoms.

The following month, FDA approved Soliris as a treatment for some adults with generalized myasthenia gravis (MG). The drug can help patients improve their quality of life by reducing symptoms such as double vision and difficulty with speech, swallowing or breathing.

In December, FDA approved Spinraza, the first disease-modifying drug to treat spinal muscular atrophy (SMA). Spinraza already is helping children with SMA, who might have never expected to move around without a wheelchair, learn to walk.

Also in December, researchers announced that a clinical trial of Ionis-HTTRx, a drug designed to treat Huntington's disease, showed that the drug significantly reduced levels of the

toxic protein that causes the disease and that it was safe for human use.

Thanks to these breakthrough medications, more people with neuromuscular diseases can expect to live longer and more independent lives. MDA now has more than 180 research projects underway around the world that could hold answers for the next breakthroughs.

MDA also is working to advance genetic testing for newborns to ensure that babies with certain neuromuscular diseases are treated as soon as possible after birth, when treatments are likely to provide the greatest benefit.

Along with sponsoring medical treatment, MDA provides support for families affected by neuromuscular diseases, including the popular summer camps across the country where letter carriers often serve as volunteers.

"Our efforts to support the mission of MDA are bearing fruit," NALC President Fredric Rolando said. "Children

with these diseases are living longer, feeling better and doing more—and their families are hopeful—thanks to the many letter carrier volunteers who organize and participate in MDA events across the country."

### The president goes to "jail"

The president does his part, too—last year, Rolando raised \$26,416 as a "jailbird." After a mock arrest, he called donors to raise enough money for MDA to bail him out of jail. And on May 19, he will participate in an MDA Muscle Walk fundraising event. (See page 18 for more.)

Each generation of letter carriers passes the MDA torch to a new generation and, as NALC's membership changes, so do the MDA fundraising events. Whether working as a team of letter carriers or joining larger fundraising events, NALC members of all ages are boosting the energy and commitment level for MDA support.

In this annual review of efforts by branches and individual letter carriers to support MDA, *The Postal Record* brings you some examples of the various ways our union members turn out for the cause, including

new MDA coordinators, new participants and new kinds of events.

### Tough mudders get dirty for MDA

When **Roy Jancio** assumed the role of MDA coordinator for New Jersey Merged Branch 38, he had big shoes to fill. Branch 38 often ranks as a top fundraiser, and Jancio wanted to keep the trend going.

"We've been leading the way in raising money for MDA in the NALC," he said, "But we were always getting the same people at the events."

The branch has enjoyed success with traditional events, such as a golf outing and participating in the local MDA Muscle Walk, but Jancio looked around for a new kind of event to shake things up.

"How can we get younger people, new people, to come out?" Jancio asked himself. The answer was a Tough Mudder run.

Take a three-, five- or 10-mile run, throw in obstacles that require teamwork to overcome, and add mud—lots of mud—and you have a Tough Mudder run. The events, which are held across the country to raise funds for various causes, require runners with a team spirit and no fear of getting filthy for a cause.

"We had 22 participants," Jancio said. "Most of them were new people." Jancio joined them in the muddy five-mile race. Each participant paid a \$66 entry fee and raised an average of \$200

each from friends and family for MDA. The event helped the branch raise a total of \$21,141 for MDA last year.

Jancio hopes the Tough Mudder event will continue to succeed—25 participants already have committed to running next year.

## Events from all angles

Arizona Merged Branch 1902 makes it difficult to not find an MDA event to enjoy.

In the past year or so, the branch’s MDA events have included its annual golf tournament, two pool tournaments,

two poker games, a bingo night, a local MDA Muscle Walk and a bowlathon.

The branch’s MDA coordinator, **Gordy McCune**, took the job in early 2017 and has expanded the list of events by seeking member input.

When a young letter carrier asked about participating in a bowling event because he didn’t play golf, McCune revived the branch’s bowlathon, last held in 2015. McCune found a new bowling venue with reasonable prices by asking other fundraising organizations where they bowled. He kept things interesting by layering new games over the bowling—a bingo game that counted different bowling scores

and a poker game that awarded cards based on bowling shots—with prizes awarded for each.

The bowlathon attracted 36 bowlers who raised \$695 for MDA, and McCune hopes to have another soon. “Word of mouth is going to get out,” he said. “It definitely has potential for growth.”

With the frequent events and appeals for donations at monthly union meetings, the branch raised \$20,073 last year, the top amount among branches with 1,000 to 1,499 members.

“It all adds up,” McCune said.

McCune says he will continue to tap into the energy of new letter carriers to expand his branch’s MDA fundraising

efforts by soliciting their ideas and getting them out to events.

"We always try to get the younger and the newer people to come out," he said. "I'm looking forward to trying new things."

The golf tournament, which raised \$11,000 last year, will remain a mainstay event for his branch, McCune added. "People count on it, they really enjoy it and they keep coming back," he said.

## Turney

Unlike some younger letter carriers, **Julie Turney** grew up watching the MDA's Labor Day Telethon.

"We would watch it as a family," she said. "My mom would make hot chocolate and pizza and we would stay up all night and watch."

Her lifelong support for MDA made Turney a natural MDA coordinator when she became a letter carrier and joined Central California Coast Branch 52. "It has always been part of my life," she said, "and when it became a branch effort for me, I focused all my efforts for MDA on the branch."

At 62 and nearing retirement, Turney is passing her lifelong passion for MDA along to a new generation.

In her decade as coordinator, Turney has helped raise thousands of dollars with bowlathons, raffles at branch meetings and the annual branch picnic, and even by running in the

Disney Superheroes 5K at Disneyland in Anaheim, CA, as part of MDA's Team Momentum program.

To pass on her fundraising abilities and her passion for MDA, Turney recruits younger carriers to collect the donated raffle prizes that drive a large portion of the branch's fundraising. She sends the carriers out with a fundraising letter she drafted to help them with the message.

"It puts them in direct contact with the business so they can help get donations for prizes, and a lot of times the people who go out and get those donations come to the fundraiser and bring their family," she said. "It's so much easier for them if they have a letter to get them started."

Turney also tries to match younger fundraisers with an experienced officer or steward in each of the 11 stations in her branch so they have someone to answer questions.

Getting young carriers out for events, though, is complicated by their busy schedules. "With the Postal Service's push for seven-day delivery, it's really hard to get new people involved," Turney said. She hopes that tweaking event schedules will help, such as changing the hours of the branch's annual bowlathon, held on a Sunday, to later in the afternoon. "This year, we're hoping to see more CCAs and family members come out," she said.

To raise money for her Team Momentum run, Turney took advantage of a fundraising program offered by a local steakhouse—the branch sold special dinner tickets at a profit. Linking the tickets to her run, rather than just a general donation to MDA, helped sell more tickets. "It's easier to promote things when there is a goal in mind," she said. Since Turney paid her own way to the run, all the dinner ticket proceeds went to MDA, helping her raise \$1,079.

## Honor Roll and branch totals

The total raised in 2017 was \$1,200,381.

"Letter carriers should be very proud of their efforts to support MDA, and the children and adults whose lives are made better and longer through its work," Rolando said.

In the list, other NALC groups, including the NALC Auxiliary, are located at the end.
