Food banks need our help. One in eight children in the United States—approximately 13 million— are, or may, experience food insecurity. When our letter carriers and other USPS employees join with people in their neighborhoods to support local pantries, it helps hard-hit families put food on the table.

On Saturday, May 11, 2024, our city and rural carriers, other national partners, and thousands of volunteers will collect food donations in 10,000 cities and towns in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and Guam, as we strive to combat hunger in America. The drive is supplemented by a year-round drive that allows convenient online donations to participating local food banks of a donor's choice throughout the year.

The Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive comes at an important time for our country's school children and their families. Holding the collection in the spring enables communities to provide timely assistance to millions who face a gap when school lunch programs are not available during the summer months.

I encourage Postal Service employees across the country to support the food drive by delivering postcards and promotional bags in advance, as well as picking up donations on May 11. Since 1993, letter carriers have collected more than 1.9 billion pounds of food. Let's make this year's 32nd drive the best in our history, as we deliver food for families in need and help stamp out hunger.
