Individual Class Member:

There is a short window of opportunity for letter carriers who may have been adversely affected by the USPS National Reassessment Process (NRP) to now file a claim for relief.

In a March 9, 2018 decision, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) found the NRP subjected approximately 130,000 injured-on-duty employees to a pattern and practice of disability discrimination, in violation of the Rehabilitation Act. The class action complaint covers all injured-on-duty employees who were reassessed under the NRP during the period 5/5/06 through 7/1/11.

The EEOC ordered the Postal Service to notify each class member within 10 calendar days of the EEOC decision. In order for each individual to now pursue relief, he or she must make a written claim within 30 days of receipt of a notice from USPS. Claims should be mailed to the Postal Service at the following address:

You have been identified as a potential class member and may have received the required notification from the Postal Service. A copy of that Postal Service notification and optional claim form is enclosed.

You may have also received communications from the attorneys who won the case (Thomas & Solomon; Kator, Parks, Weiser & Harris).

If you were subject to the NRP and believe you are entitled to individual relief, you should file a written claim with the Postal Service without delay.
