



Convention plans include baseball night, retiring officers dinner

What could be better than a warm summer night out at a ball game? How about a night out with 7,000 of your closest friends—your union brothers and sisters?

Delegates to the 67th Biennial NALC Convention in Anaheim, California, will have a chance to enjoy camaraderie on that massive scale during a special National Association of Letter Carriers Baseball Night on Tuesday, August 10.



The NALC has reserved 7,000 tickets for the Los Angeles Angels-Kansas City Royals baseball game on the second evening of the convention, which runs August 9-13. The tickets will be sold in lots to branches at a special reduced price for distribution to their delegates. They will not be sold individually.

Ticket-ordering details will be announced in an upcoming *NALC Bulletin* and included in a future *Postal Record*.

Another special event during the convention will be a Retiring Officers

Dinner honoring national union leaders who have left office since the 2006 convention in Las Vegas or who will be retiring at the end of 2010. President Emeritus William H. Young will be among those recognized.

The dinner will be the evening of Thursday, August 12. Plans are not complete, but seating will be limited. Full details on purchasing tickets will be announced in coming months.

The special baseball night will afford NALC delegates and family members an opportunity to see one of the best teams in baseball, the American League West champion Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim (with newly acquired Hideki Matsui), against an improving Royals team headed by American League Cy Young Award winner Zack Greinke.

In recognition of NALC's big turnout, President Fred Rolando has been invited to throw out the first pitch during a ceremony at Angels Stadium prior to the 7:05 p.m. start of the game.

Similar baseball events were held in conjunction with the 1992 St. Louis convention and the 2000 convention in Chicago. ☒
