The 2015 theme, "There's No Place Like Home," inspired designs about skylines, "The Wizard of Oz," Planet


> Earth, baseball and penguins, among the many other ideas that participants chose to showcase.

The top prize was awarded to Hannah C. Holder of Knoxville, TN, for a skilled and creative entry that featured a homing pigeon carrying an important message. Other unforgettable entries translated the theme to include a variety of subjects, such as full refrigerators, Hogwarts and military service members. As always, the submis-


