Letter carriers have raised many millions of dollars for the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA) since adopting MDA as the union's official charity nearly seven decades ago. Branches hold fundraising events of all kinds, from bowlathons to golf and poker tournaments to raffles and more. Our combined efforts provide major assistance for MDA's medical research and support programs for people living with neuromuscular diseases and their families.

Ever since MDA was founded in 1950, NALC has been a stalwart partner. In 1952, the union became MDA's first national sponsor and named MDA its official charity. Letter carriers have raised a total of more than \$103 million for MDA's mission since then.

Our commitment to MDA extends beyond financial support. Letter carrier volunteers participate in camps and

other activities to provide personal support and love for affected children and their families. Letter carriers who volunteer at MDA events enjoy the satisfaction of working with the children and families and seeing firsthand what their support does to help.

"I don't know of another group with such a strong and lasting commitment to their chosen cause as letter carriers," NALC President Fredric Rolando said. "After more than 65 years, our support for MDA is still going strong, and it is yielding results. People with these diseases and their families have more hope today thanks in part to our efforts."

In this issue of *The Postal Record* you will find the annual MDA Honor Roll recognizing the branches, in 10 size categories, that raised the most funds for MDA and the totals from every branch. We also talk to some of the letter carrier volunteers in branches large and small about the

various ways they contribute to the MDA fundraising cause.

The top fundraisers by branch size category were: New Jersey Merged Branch 38 (2,000-plus members), \$49,660; Denver, CO Branch 47 (1,500-1,999 members), \$15,136; Arizona Merged Branch 1902 (1,000-1,499 members), \$15,795; Northeastern New York Branch 358 (700-999 members), \$31,201; Colorado Springs, CO Branch 204 (500-699 members), \$24,522; Stamford, CT Branch 60 (350-499 members), \$20,083; Naples, FL Branch 4716, (200-349 members) \$14,086; Fargo-West Fargo, ND Branch 205 (100-199 members), \$17,485; Manitowoc, WI Branch 490 (50-99 members), \$7,867; and Goldsboro, NC Branch 876 (1-49 members), \$7,220.

While these branches put forth extraordinary effort, every dollar counts—and so the efforts of every branch help us help MDA in its important work. Branches of every size continue to use tried-and-true fundraising events and experiment with new ideas to boost their totals, and many also help by giving their time and love at MDA events with children and families affected by neuromuscular diseases. The branches used events such as bowlathons, fill-the-satchel, golf and poker tournaments, silent auctions and many more.

To help branches sustain and expand their fundraising efforts, here are some of the ways letter carriers across the country approach the task of supporting MDA.

New coordinators learn the ropes quickly

When he took over as MDA coordinator for Portland, OR Branch 82 five years ago, **Abe RedCloud** had big shoes to fill.

“The person stepping down, **Debbie Burbank**, was excellent at what she did,” he said. “She had me watch and learn at the events she did for a year.” Relying on her experience, and his own background raising funds for other charities, RedCloud hit the ground running.

His first year, he sustained the success by continuing the branch’s traditional events, including the bowl-athon, raffles and poker tournaments. But RedCloud soon put his own stamp on the branch’s MDA efforts to squeeze more money out of the events.

“At the MDA muscle walk, I added a fundraiser to ‘splash out the MD monster,’” he recalled. “People would buy water balloons, three for \$1, and throw them at me and other volunteers

holding up some monsters I made out of cardboard. It was a great time and the kids loved it.” That raised \$50 quickly—plus another \$50 when he announced that if enough people put money in the pot, he would let someone dump the cold water from the water balloon bucket on his head.

“The best cold-water challenge ever,” he said.

RedCloud also got creative with new venues to attract more attention. When the branch’s poker tournament fell behind on fundraising goals, the branch dropped it in favor of a tournament at a local pinball place. On the other hand, the old standbys continued to grow: “The bowling event went off the charts and we raised \$9,000 after expenses to the bowling alley,” he said, “and the raffle sold out and we raised \$1,800.”

Another MDA coordinator, **Jemmeyen Macaraeg**, has learned to think big. Last year, she joined an MDA Muscle Walk just a week before the event and managed to raise nearly \$1,700.

A member of Van Nuys, CA Branch



2462, Macaraeg became her branch's MDA coordinator three years ago. She wanted to participate in a Muscle Walk—an MDA fundraising event held in more than 150 towns nationwide—and learned last October that a nearby walk was scheduled for the following week. She didn't look back, setting a goal of \$1,500 and exceeding it by soliciting donations through Facebook and around the office.

After taking on the responsibilities of MDA coordinator, Macaraeg put on her thinking cap to find new ways to raise money for MDA, large and small.

Macaraeg asked carriers to donate old items and then held a weekend yard sale with the proceeds going to MDA, raising \$800.

In addition, Macaraeg sells crafts on Etsy and donates \$1 of every sale she

time and effort to help other children. "I want to try to do whatever I can to help them out," she said. "I'm always about helping other people."

Consistency works

With the help of many fellow carriers in Fargo-West Fargo, ND Branch 205, MDA Coordinator **Randy Sorby** raises thousands of dollars each year for MDA with two reliable fundraising events.

"Our small fundraiser is selling local coupon books at \$25 a piece," he said, with the branch making \$10 on each. "Last year, 217 books sold—an easy \$2,170." With a new coupon book out each year, the branch can rely on repeat customers.

"The big money," Sorby said, "is our annual auction held in the spring." The branch has held the auction for 35 years with growing success—last year's auction attracted nearly 250 bidders and yielded \$14,650.

Sorby praised fellow Branch 205 members **Lon Smedsrud, Dave Chapman and Mike Drewelow**

for their help with the auction.

Sorby said it's the children MDA serves who keep him and his fellow carriers consistent in their support for MDA, especially at MDA camps.

"Summer camps are what every kid looks forward to," he said. "My wife and I have attended four. Camps are for these kids to be kids for a week—

kids with laughs and smiles.

"These kids with muscular dystrophy inspire me," he added. "It's for the kids."

Experience pays

Karen Evans literally won her job as Stamford, CT Branch 60's MDA coordinator. Two decades ago, when the previous branch president and coordinator was about to retire and Evans was a new carrier, Evans won an incentive prize for selling the most tickets for the branch's MDA raffle—and the branch gave her the job of coordinator to go with it.

Evans, who now also serves as branch treasurer, accepted the MDA coordinator position and never looked back. Her branch raised the most in its size category this year with only a few major events—a pair of Texas hold-'em tournaments, one in the spring and one in the fall, and a "Left Right Center" dice game at a local club—and requests for donations at every branch meeting and social event of the year.

"We pass the hat at the barbecues, at the branch meetings—whenever we meet," Evans said. Persistence helps: "Some of the carriers would rather hand me their money than hear my mouth," Evans added.

There's no reason for only one branch member to handle MDA responsibilities alone, and as with some other branches, Evans relies on her fellow letter carriers. Two other branch activists, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer **Amanda Parent** and Secretary **Joe Fusco**, assist Evans. She praised friends and family members of letter carriers for their support of the poker tournaments as well.

The work they do is well worth the effort, Evans said. "At the end of the day, the most important thing is that the kids go to camp, and they're able to take their medicine," she said, "and we find a cure."

Two of Macaraeg's daughters, along with three nieces, joined her on the Muscle Walk. She said her own children motivate her to help children with muscular dystrophy. The walk "was really an eye-opener, and heart-warming," she said. Thinking of her own children moves her to give her

Up close with kids

When MDA of Philadelphia asked Cherry Hill/Haddonfield, NJ Branch 769 to participate at Christmastime last year in an event with children who have muscular dystrophy, the branch knew exactly what to do.

"We said we'll do letters to Santa," **Michele Galda**, president and MDA coordinator for Branch 769, recalled, "because, after all, we are letter carriers."

Galda and a few other carriers from her branch, joined by Region 12 Regional Administrative Assistant Brian Thompson, provided all the supplies and support the kids needed to have a great time. About 25 children with muscular dystrophy wrote letters to put into a mailbox provided by the branch. Branch members assisted with some of the letters.

It was the branch's first event working with children. "We always do MDA fundraising, but nothing directly involving the kids," Galda said. "We're going to make it a main event now. It was great seeing them smile."

Galda said that working directly with children from MDA made the event extra fulfilling. "One time, a little girl ran up to me and wrapped her arms around my legs and hugged me," she said. "This is why we do what we do for MDA. It was truly a special moment."

The letter carriers also brought small toys and gifts for the kids, and every letter to Santa received a personal response written by branch member **Jennifer Schwartz**.

Schwartz has some Santa experience under her belt—she routinely answers letters to Santa from children on her route and for other letter carriers as well. She put that skill to good use by answering about 30 letters written by youngsters with muscular

dystrophy at the event. A few responses brought extra challenges—though she wishes she could promise a cure for muscular dystrophy from Santa, as one child asked for, Schwartz knew Santa can't bring that, at least not yet. With the help of MDA, though, Santa Claus may one day bring children the gift of a cure.

From funding to results

MDA puts the money letter carriers raise to good use. The funds go toward medical research on dozens of neuromuscular diseases to develop treatments to ease symptoms and extend life spans. It also supports children and their families living with these diseases.

MDA is the nation's largest nonprofit supporter of research on neuromuscular diseases, funding hundreds of physicians and scientists in the fight to free children—and the families who love them—from the harm caused by muscular dystrophy and more than 40 related muscle-debilitating diseases. MDA's efforts have contributed to numerous major advances in muscle biology and therapy development over the decades.

MDA-sponsored research has resulted in breakthroughs in treating diseases to extend lives, ease symptoms and make life more livable. Even where no "cure" is available yet, MDA research has resulted in better treatments that lead to increased survival and better quality of life. For instance, in the past, most boys with Duchenne muscular dystrophy died in their teens, but there are now some 40-year-old men living with the disease.

MDA has been involved in research into basic muscle and nerve biology since its inception, when little was known about how muscles were formed or functioned. Since then, thousands of scientific papers have been published explaining how the tissues work and what goes wrong in neuromuscular disease. MDA funding supported the research that led to the discovery of the genetic causes of dozens of diseases, starting with the discovery of the dystrophin gene in 1986. Without this knowledge, there was no hope for curing these diseases. This research is paying dividends as new medications and therapies are being developed.

Honor Roll

Each year, *The Postal Record* publishes the MDA fundraising results of each branch from the previous year, as reported to us by MDA. The branches listed on the next two pages have joined the shared vision NALC set out to realize in 1952 and every year thereafter. Below are the 2018 MDA fundraising results for NALC. These combined efforts resulted in a grand total of \$1,368,816 raised for MDA last year.
